

Mouth of the Chidro River

In the Roman era, there was a mooring on the Chidro used by mariners in order to obtain supplies of fresh water. There have been many archaeological finds here, including nine marble sarcophagi – cargo of a ship ending its voyage here 2,000 years ago. Legend has it that St. Peter, while travelling to Rome, landed here and that it was at the mouth of this icy spring that he celebrated the first Christian baptisms on Italian soil.
